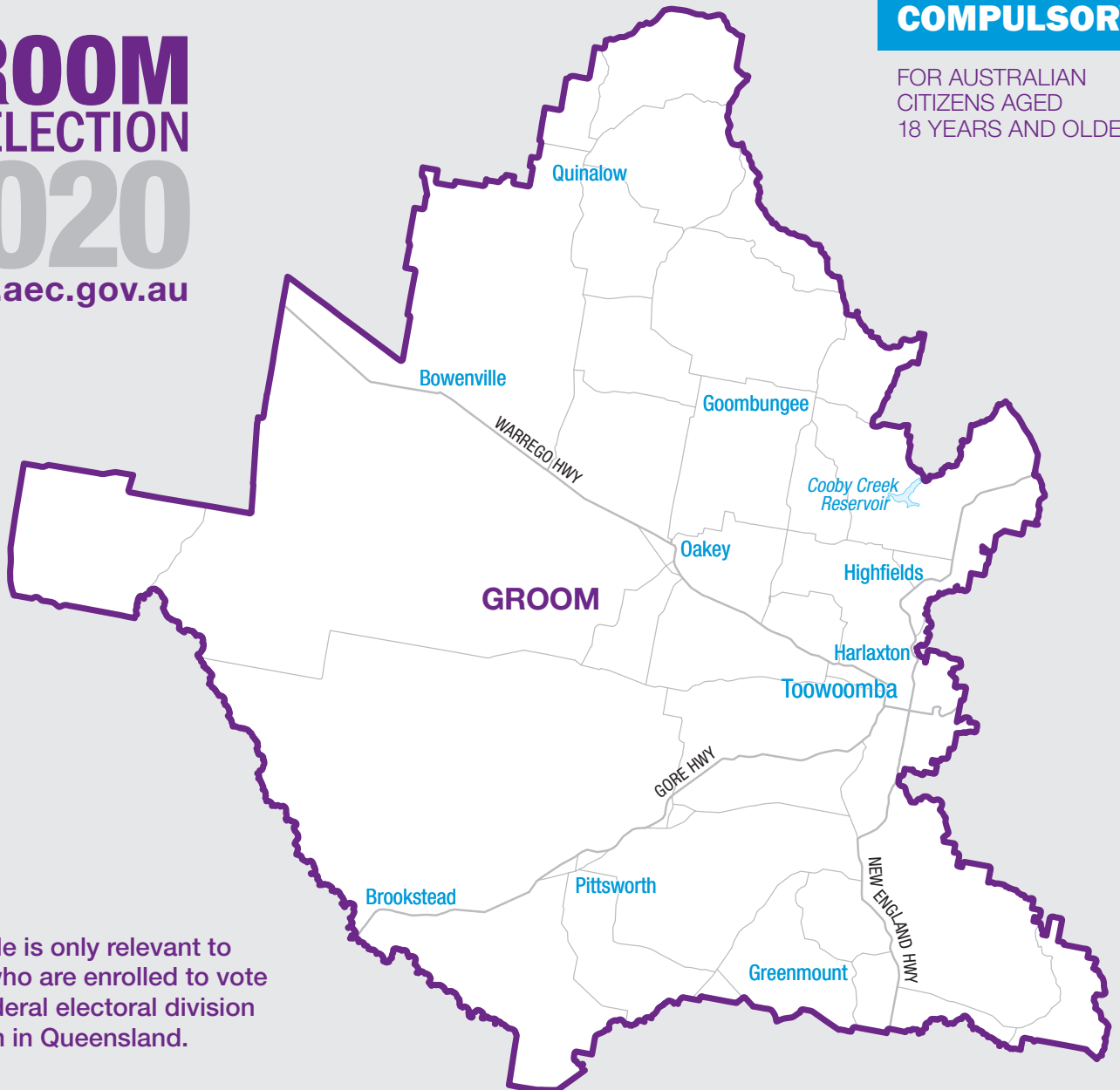

Message from the Electoral Commissioner

The AEC is committed to providing the highest standard of electoral services during the Groom by-election. During the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic this includes being at the forefront of protecting the health of voters, AEC staff and other participants.

Your wellbeing and that of the Groom community is important to the AEC. That is why at this by-election we will implement a range of protective measures at polling places, including social distancing and other hygiene practices. These, and the other actions outlined in this guide, are based on advice from health authorities and conform to specific restrictions and rules in place.

While these measures are designed to protect the community, they may also slow the voting and counting processes at this by-election. It may take longer for you to cast your vote at the polling place, and you may have to queue under social distancing rules. Please help us protect your wellbeing and that of your community by following the advice on the signs at the polling place and by listening to the directions of AEC staff. We are all practised

in following such rules in recent times, and it is important to maintain this when voting. I ask for and appreciate both your patience and cooperation with the measures.

I trust the information provided in this guide will help you confidently plan ahead for your vote at this by-election. It details the protective actions we have taken and the range of voting options available to meet your personal circumstances, including postal voting, more early voting centres, and of course a large number of polling places in the electorate on by-election day.

Stop and consider Check the source this by-election

During electoral events there is a large amount of information being distributed which is seeking to influence your vote.

It's important that you consider what you see, hear or read. Take the time to consider whether the information is from a reliable or recognisable source, current and safe (not a scam). If you have doubts about information there are questions you can ask to help you form your own opinion and make a decision. To find out more visit www.aec.gov.au/stopandconsider

The Groom by-election will be held on Saturday 28 November 2020. Polling places open at 8am and close at 6pm sharp.

Why?

You will be voting for a representative for the federal electoral division of Groom in the House of Representatives. This by-election is being held following the resignation of the member for Groom.

Who has to vote?

If you are enrolled in the federal electoral division of Groom you are required to vote in the by-election. If you are not sure whether you are enrolled in the division of Groom, you should check your enrolment information at

www.aec.gov.au/check or call **13 23 26** if you need help.

What if I can't make it?

If you can't make it to a polling place on by-election day, you may be entitled to vote early.

By post

Postal voting is an important voting option available to eligible voters at this by-election.

You can apply for a postal vote online at www.aec.gov.au/pva

Please call **13 23 26** if you don't have online access and want to apply for a postal vote.

The AEC must receive your application as soon as possible and no later than 6pm local time Wednesday 25 November 2020.

In person

If you are entitled to vote early, you can vote at an early voting centre (below) from Wednesday 11 November 2020.

Changes may occur to the information below.

Plan ahead before you vote

- While voting is often a social activity, for this by-election please limit attendance at polling places to eligible voters only, and avoid socialising.
- Do your research on candidates and preferences before you go to vote.
- Single-use pencils will be given out at the polling place, but if you prefer you can bring your own pen or pencil to vote.
- If you are feeling unwell or have any cold or flu symptoms in the lead up to by-election day, don't attend a polling place. Postal voting is available. Apply online at www.aec.gov.au/pva
- Download the **COVIDSafe** app.

What happens at the polling place, including new COVID-19 safety measures



Stay at home if you are unwell



Cover your coughs and sneezes



Sanitise your hands



Stand 1.5 metres apart

Due to COVID-19, health and safety measures at early voting centres and polling places will include:

- The number of voters in a polling place at any one time will be managed.
 - If, on arrival, you are not able to enter the polling place immediately you may be required to queue outside, keeping an appropriate distance from others.
 - Once inside, hand sanitiser will be available for use.
 - You will need to keep your distance from others when waiting to receive your ballot paper, with floor markers in place to guide you.
 - When you reach the ballot paper issuing point, a polling official will ask for your full name and address, and if you have voted before in the 2020 Groom by-election. Your name will be marked off the electoral roll.
- You will be given your green ballot paper for the House of Representatives.
 - If you haven't got your own pen or pencil, you will be given a single-use pencil.
 - Voting booths will be separated and regularly cleaned.
 - Read the instructions on your ballot paper carefully.
 - Complete your ballot paper. You must number every box to make your vote count.
 - Take your pen or pencil with you—don't leave it in the booth.
 - Once you have completed your ballot paper, fold it and place it in the ballot box provided.

Remember, if you need help, you can ask a polling official.



Where?

You can vote at any polling place in the federal electoral division of Groom on by-election day.

Please note that polling place locations may have changed since you last voted. At the time of printing this publication, the locations of some polling places were yet to be confirmed. Final locations are available at www.aec.gov.au/groom

The final list of polling places, along with a list of candidates, will be published in the *High Country Herald* on Tuesday 24 November, *The Pittsworth Sentinel* and *The Oakey Champion* on Wednesday 25 November, *On Our Selection News* on Thursday 26 November and *The Chronicle* (Toowoomba) on Friday 27 November.
