Australia's Electoral Boundaries

This map is for illustrative purposes only to indicate the location of electoral division boundaries for the House of Representatives. The number of House of Representative seats for each state and territory for the next federal election will be as follows:

New South Wales	48
Victoria	37
Queensland	30
Western Australia	15
South Australia	11
Tasmania	5
Australian Capital Territory	2
Northern Territory	2
Total	150

Following the 2010 federal election, redistributions of federal electoral divisions were determined for Victoria in 2010 and South Australia in 2011.

Redistributions took place in Victoria and South Australia because seven years had passed since the last redistributions. While these redistributions redrew the boundaries to ensure similar numbers of electors in each division, no new divisions were created and none were abolished.

Note: The map includes a table showing marginality of seats in ascending order. These figures are based on Two Party Preferred (TPP) vote count figures from the 2010 federal election for New South Wales, Queensland, Western Australia, Tasmania, the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory where preferences have been distributed to the Australian Labor Party and the Liberal/National Coalition.

A Two Candidate Preferred (TCP) table is also included showing the marginality of eight seats where one of the two leading candidates were not the ALP and the Liberal/National Coalition.

As Victoria and South Australia have undergone a redistribution since the last federal election, notional TPP and/or TCP vote count figures for those states have been calculated.
