Dear Committee Members,

It my pleasure to submit Suggestions on behalf of the Liberal Party of Australia (New South Wales Division. We have used the Electoral Boundary Mapping System (EBMS) software provided by the AEC so that our Suggestions can easily be viewed and analysed by Committee Members and staff.

Please be advised our Suggestions comprise the following:

- 1. A written summary of Suggestions with a commentary on the methodology we have used in formulating them and detailed written descriptions of our 49 suggested seats;
- 2. The Suggestions in electronic format for display on the Committee's website, to facilitate a smooth commencement to the period allowed for Comments; and
- 3. The Suggestions in EBMS format which we understand will be the most suitable format for Committee Members and Staff to analyse the suggested boundaries in detail.

Our written descriptions have been provided for the benefit of members of the public without access to EBMS. While every care has been taken to ensure they are accurate, inevitably there will be some errors due to the short time available for compiling and checking them. Committee Members and staff will of course be able to see the actual boundaries in EBMS format and should rely on those rather than the written descriptions.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. A regional analysis of projected enrolment growth makes it clear that the seat to be abolished is in the inner south-western suburbs of Southern Sydney. We abolish Blaxland.

By abolishing a seat in the region with low current enrolments and low projected enrolment growth, we minimise the need for changes elsewhere. Assertions that a country seat must be abolished because of low growth are clearly wrong.

2. Consequently, our Suggestions involve minimal changes for a very large number of seats, despite the need to abolish a seat. Three seats (Calare, Cowper and Throsby) have no changes at all. Twelve seats (Bennelong, Chifley, Farrer, Grayndler, Lindsay, Mackellar, Macquarie, New England, Page, Parkes, Robertson and Wentworth) retain 100 percent of their existing electors and just have minor additions. Three other high-growth seats (Eden-Monaro, Greenway and Sydney) are smaller versions; they gain no electors from other seats, but lose some to fall within the permissible range.

3. We use clear natural and man-made physical features as boundaries. We avoid splitting shires in rural areas.

METHODOLOGY

At the outset, we should note that the Suggestions of the Liberal Party fully comply with the statutory requirements of Section 66(3) of the Commonwealth Electoral Act.

In this respect, there are a number of core principles that guide our approach.

First, the Act requires the Committee to give due consideration to "the boundaries of existing Divisions in the State". Despite the fact that this redistribution results from a determination under Section 48 (1) of the Act, with the abolition of a New South Wales seat resulting, we believe that the Committee is nevertheless obliged to consider existing boundaries. Inevitably, there must be changes in seats where growth and/or current enrolments are low, with consequential changes to other seats.

However, a proposal that minimises unnecessary change best complies with the 'letter' and 'spirit' of the Act.

Second, electoral draftsmen have generally regarded the use of "building blocks" as a helpful way of approaching the task of drawing boundaries. The geographic features of the State and the way they relate to the statutory criteria, particularly Sections 66 (3) (i), (ii) and (iii), dictate such an approach and we have followed it in our analysis. We present our suggestions in seven logical "building blocks" so that the Committee can readily appreciate our reasoning.

Third, in rural seats, economic, social and regional interests tend to have a greater salience. Local government area (LGA) boundaries are generally a far stronger indicator of community of interest than elsewhere in the State. It follows that electoral boundaries should be drawn in rural areas that incorporate whole local government areas in the one seat, with splits minimised. By and large, local government boundaries also reflect the significant natural physical features of the State. Our Suggestions also take into account the revision of LGA boundaries over the last three years.

Fourth, in metropolitan areas, local government boundaries are less helpful than in rural areas. They predate much of metropolitan Sydney's growth and are a historical curiosity in some parts of Sydney and Newcastle. Considerations of community of interest are less salient than in rural areas, but still of much significance. The critical factor in metropolitan areas is drawing a boundary that is easily understood by

<u>constituents</u>. In metropolitan areas, natural physical features such as waterways and bushland make good boundaries. In the absence of such natural boundaries, manmade physical features such as railway lines and significant roads are also helpful in ensuring a constituent understands seat boundaries. The same applies to suburbs. Residents know which suburb they live in and including whole suburbs in seats is avoids confusion.

Finally, the demographic aspects of the statutory criteria have two elements: actual and projected enrolments. At both the time the quota is struck and the "projection time", the Act provides a maximum and minimum permissible variation from the average. This variation has been provided by Parliament so that it is possible to have regard for the geographic aspects of the statutory criteria in Section 66 (3) (b) of the Act.

We support the past practice of Redistribution Commissioners using the full permissible variation to allow sensible seats to be drawn. There is no requirement that each seat must be drawn so that their actual enrolment has negligible variation from the quota, or that the projected enrolment should have negligible variation from the average divisional enrolment at the "projection time".

SUGGESTIONS IN DETAIL

North Coast, Newcastle and Central Coast

The ten seats, bordered by the Queensland border at the north, the Pacific Ocean at the east, the wide lower reaches of the Hawkesbury River in the south and the Great Dividing Range at the west, are among those with the highest projections of enrolment growth in the state.

These ten existing seats are also projected to have 9.9 quotas at the 'projection time'. Only Page, Shortland and Robertson have projected growth under the state average. In fact, all but two would fall within the permissible variation at the 'projection time'. It follows that this region is essentially capable of reaching numerical compliance with minor adjustments between seats.

The two far north coast seats are self-adjusting, with Richmond's surplus bringing Page above the permissible minimum. This can easily be accomplished by moving the town of Lennox Head from **Richmond** to **Page**. We note that the Ballina LGA is already split and it is not possible to wholly contain it within one seat.

Cowper has 92563 electors at the projection time and requires no further adjustment. Any change to its southern boundary would diminish community of interest. It is best that the communities close to Kempsey, such as Frederickton, stay with that centre in the seat of Lyne, reflecting their community of interest.

Lyne has 100250 electors at the 'projection time' and a significant deletion is appropriate. Inevitably, it is necessary to transfer part of the Greater Taree LGA to the seat of **Paterson**. The obvious starting point is Diamond Beach and Halliday's Point. Given Lyne's size, it is also necessary to move either Wingham or Old Bar. Wingham has strong links to Gloucester and there would be a case for its transfer. However, Old Bar is probably a better fit in Paterson. The adjacent village of Wallabi Point is also transferred, along with Oxley's and Mitchell's Islands, which are accessed via the Old Bar Road. We also transfer the rest of Nabiac and the Krambach district.

These additions permit Paterson to shed all its Newcastle LGA and Maitland LGA components that should properly be in the federal seats of Newcastle and Hunter respectively. A qualification is that Woodberry is transferred to Newcastle as well. Although part of Maitland LGA, it is effectively a twin town of Beresfield and much has been said in State and Federal redistributions over the years about why these two towns should be in the same seat.

Little change is required to the Central Coast seats of Robertson and Dobell. We suggest that **Robertson** gain a small section of the suburb of Wyoming from Dobell. We use Wingello Creek, which flows largely through a reserve, as the northern boundary. Birch Road and a reserve is the eastern boundary. This section of Gosford LGA is within easy walking distance of the Gosford CBD, where the Member for Robertson has his electorate office.

Dobell currently enjoys a clear easily understood northern boundary. Only Gorokan is split and then by Wallarah Road, the most significant road in the town. Rather than an unsatisfactory split of Gorokan or a new split of Toukley, we suggest that the whole town of Norah Head be transferred to Dobell.

Very few changes are required in the three seats covering Newcastle and Lake Macquarie LGAs. **Shortland** is the low growth seat in the region and, having lost Norah Head, requires additions. Conveniently, this can be achieved by ending the current split of the Charlestown CBD between seats. We also add the adjacent Kotara area, using the main northern railway line as the northern boundary. **Charlton** is adjusted by gaining the town of Eleebana and Mount Hutton. We also realign the boundary between Charlton and Newcastle to follow the LGA boundary. With the

addition of Beresfield and Woodberry, **Newcastle** also reaches the margin falls within the permissible range at the 'projection time'.

Rural New South Wales

Contrary to popular misconceptions, enrolment growth outside the Newcastle-Sydney-Wollongong conurbation is robust. While some seats have low enrolments and projected growth, they abut high growth seats and can be easily adjusted with minimal changes and the retention of many existing boundaries. There is no case for the abolition of a seat in rural New South Wales.

Hunter gains Paterson's Hunter LGA component (Thornton and Morpeth), although not Woodberry, as previously mentioned. With this addition and as a high growth seat, it can play a part in adjusting those seats in the north-west of the State that are low growth and currently with low enrolments.

Gwydir already includes parts of the upper Hunter valley (the renamed Upper Hunter LGA) and included Muswellbrook LGA prior to the 1991 federal redistribution. We transfer the whole of Muswellbrook LGA to Gwydir. **New England** already contains some of the renamed Gwydir LGA (formerly Bingara LGA). We transfer the balance

of Gwydir LGA (formerly Yalaroi LGA) to New England. Admittedly, these changes leave both seats just above the minimum permissible number of electors at the 'projection time'. We submit this fully complies with the demographic statutory criterion. Moreover, it facilitates sensible boundaries in the west and south-west of the State. One of the complexities is the proximity of Dubbo to the western boundary of Gwydir. A different arrangement would necessitate major change to seats with Dubbo shifting. In the alternative, Gwydir would have to expand considerably in the low-density north-west part of the State. We think our suggestion is superior.

Calare, is projected to grow to 92670 electors and therefore requires no adjustment.

With the major centres of Dubbo, Albury and Wagga Wagga as their 'anchors', Parkes, Farrer and Riverina have modest enrolment growth. With Gwydir's deficit met from elsewhere, these three western seats can be adjusted with minimal changes. High-growth Hume facilitates the changes by shedding Young and Harden LGAs. **Parkes** gains Young LGA. **Farrer** gains Hay LGA from Riverina and its eastern boundary is adjusted to ensure all of the redrawn Tumut LGA is included in that seat. **Riverina**, a seat already having a reasonably strong starting point in terms of enrolment, needs only gains Harden LGA to compensate for the loss of Hay.

Eden-Monaro and Gilmore are growing well-above the State average. From their surplus, they can compensate Hume for the loss of Harden and Young LGAs. **Hume,** which already includes the towns of Murrumbateman and Gundaroo, gains Sutton and Bungendore. All four relate strongly to Canberra and many workers in the national capital commute from these towns. Hume, which already includes the Southern Highlands towns of Mittagong and Bowral, also gains Moss Vale, Sutton Forest, Exeter and Bundanoon from Gilmore. This consolidates almost all of the Wingecaribee LGA in one seat. The exception is Robertson and Burrawang, which remain in Gilmore. This also reflects State boundaries, with these two villages in the State seat of Kiama, and we have used the State boundary around these villages to minimise confusion.

The current seat of **Eden-Monaro** would have 100916 electors at the 'projection time'. The loss of Bungendore and Sutton is not sufficient to bring it below the maximum permissible number of electors. We suggest the Clyde and Buckenbowra Rivers be used as a boundary to achieve the additional reduction. This would mean that the villages of South Durras, Benandarah, Long Beach, Maloney's Beach, Surfside and Nelligen are transferred to **Gilmore**. No other changes are required to Gilmore. It remains a seat comprising principally the Shoalhaven and Kiama LGAs, with Robertson and Burrawang and the transferred coastal villages from Eden-Monaro. This is appropriate, as its northern neighbour, Throsby, has 92851 electors at the

'projected time' and requires no adjustment. Further, the distinctive characters of Throsby, as a seat based on the southern suburbs of Wollongong, and Gilmore, as a coastal rural seat, are preserved with the local government boundary delineating the two.

With additions adjacent to the Australian Capital Territory and in the Southern Highlands, Hume can afford to shed two discrete areas on its northern border. This helps to consolidate Hume in area and distance from one end to the other. Warragamba township is on the northern periphery of Wollondilly LGA and, therefore, is currently in the seat of Hume. It is, however only a short drive from Penrith, with which it has substantial links. In fact, Penrith is considerably closer than Picton, where the council has its headquarters, let alone Goulburn, where the Member for Hume's Electorate office is located. It is properly relocated to Lindsay, along with Bringelly from Macarthur. Appin township is transferred from Hume to Macarthur, given its strong links to Campbelltown.

Outer Western Sydney

Outer Western Sydney has very strong growth and its projected enrolment at the 'projection time' is 8.96 quotas. Very little change to the existing boundaries is required.

Macquarie is simply adjusted by incorporating all the lower Hawkesbury towns around the confluence of the Colo, Macdonald and Hawkesbury Rivers. This makes enormous sense as localities that span the river-based boundary between Macquarie, Mitchell and Berowra are currently split. We transfer Wiseman's Ferry, Maroota, Cattai and other rural localities on the southern bank of the Hawkesbury River to Macquarie. These towns already enjoy strong links to Windsor and Richmond, in the seat of Macquarie.

Lindsay, as mentioned earlier, reaches the permissible range by gaining the communities of Warragamba and Bringelly from Hume and Macarthur. **Chifley** and **Greenway** are essentially self-adjusting within their current boundaries. Reservoir Road and Balmoral Street, which forms a major arterial road corridor, becomes the boundary at the southern end of the seats. This involves the transfer of 4739 votes to Chifley. Otherwise, the boundaries are unchanged.

Macarthur is growing more quickly than most other seats. Currently, however, it has a very low enrolment. As a result, very few changes are required. After gaining Appin from Hume, we consolidate the seat on its Camden and Campbelltown LGA components, with other areas transferred to Lindsay.

The **Parramatta** seat currently extends to three LGAs: Parramatta, Holroyd and Baulkham Hills. It is also adjacent to the northern Sydney seats that have lower growth and a need to gain territory and electors to meet the projected quota. The obvious transfer is the Baulkham Hills component of Parramatta. This sheds 13699 to Mitchell, including Carlingford, North Rocks and Oatlands. James Ruse Drive, Kissing Point Road and the railway line to Carlingford become the new boundary between Mitchell and Parramatta. South Wentworthville, Merrylands and some of Granville, in Prospect and Reid, are transferred to Parramatta.

Prospect, **Fowler** and **Werriwa** are all growing seats that can accommodate the higher quota without significant changes to their composition. Werriwa gains Austral from Macarthur and Liverpool South from Fowler. It loses Green Valley and Miller to Fowler, where growth is below average. We realign the unsatisfactory boundary between Prospect and Fowler through Edensor Park to the natural boundary of Orphan School Creek, which is now used as Fowler's northern boundary, along with Prospect Creek into which it flows. This also reflects the boundary between suburbs. Prospect also gains the suburb of Guildford West from Reid to compensate.

Northern Sydney

High growth in Mitchell and a transfer from Parramatta facilitate adjustment of the northern Sydney seats. Mitchell and Berowra absorb significant change but the other five seats are relatively straightforward.

Mackellar re-absorbs Dee Why to Pacific Parade. This was previously the boundary. The suburb of Cremorne compensates **Warringah**. Cremorne Point, with its orientation to Sydney Harbour remains in North Sydney. This is the opportunity to tidy up the unsatisfactory boundary between Bradfield and **North Sydney**. We suggest the use of the LGA boundary (Boundary Street) and the railway line as a far preferable and easily explained boundary. Chatswood West stays in Bradfield, while Chatswood, Willoughby are united in North Sydney, with Castle Cove and Middle Cove also transferred.

The Prime Minister's seat of **Bennelong** has 0.93 quotas at the 'projection time'. This seat already contains the whole of Ryde LGA and part of Hornsby LGA. We suggest the appropriate expansion is into Beecroft and Cheltenham, gaining 8045 electors. These suburbs are also within Hornsby LGA. Pennant Hills Road, which already forms part of the western boundary, becomes the new northern boundary as well.

Each of **Bradfield**, **Berowra** and **Mitchell** progressively move west and then south to absorb the Baulkham Hills LGA transfer from Parramatta. Bradfield's western boundary becomes the railway line, the suburb boundary between Waitara and Hornsby, and Sherbrooke Road. The new western boundary for Berowra is the LGA

boundary between Blacktown and Baulkham Hills LGA (Windsor Road). The southern boundary between Berowra and Mitchell is the same as the new State electoral boundary between Hawkesbury, Baulkham Hills and Castle Hill. As a result, Kenthurst, Annangrove, Glenhaven, Rouse Hill and Kellyville are transferred to Berowra. Some of Cherrybrook is transferred from Berowra to Mitchell to facilitate sensible boundaries for these seats.

Central Sydney

The five seats in central Sydney have sharp contrasts. However, the very high growth in Lowe and Sydney, coupled with the deficits in the other three seats, mean that there is little impact on seats further to the south-west. While the region has 4.91 quotas at the 'projection time', these five seats can easily reach quota with better boundaries resulting, including a more extensive use of the Cooks River.

Sydney's considerable surplus is large enough to compensate both Wentworth and Kingsford-Smith, without major change to the character of either seat. We suggest Wentworth should return to its previous southern boundary that pertained prior to the 1999 Redistribution. This reunites all of Clovelly in the one seat and returns the Gordon's Bay precinct of Coogee to Wentworth as well. With this gain of 4733 electors, Wentworth can then adopt South Dowling Street and Boundary Street (the LGA boundary which is also currently used) as its western boundary with Sydney. This unites all of Paddington in one seat and transfers Centennial Park to Wentworth, which has close links to Paddington. Kingsford-Smith then gains 7888 electors at the southern end of Sydney. This includes Rosebery, Beaconsfield and Zetland. We use Sydney Park Road, McEvoy Street, Botany Road, Bourke Street and O'Dea Avenue to the north of these suburbs as the new boundary. These roads constitute another clear,

easily explained boundary. The important Redfern/Waterloo precinct, which is the subject of a major State Government program, remains intact in the seat of Sydney.

The southern boundary of **Lowe** is realigned to the clear natural boundary of the Cooks River. This means that South Strathfield is transferred from Blaxland, while Enfield is consolidated in the one seat (currently split between Lowe and Watson). With these gains and Lowe's growth, it is possible to compensate **Grayndler** by transferring the whole suburb of Haberfield from Lowe to Grayndler and realigning the boundary to the major traffic route: Frederick Street, Milton Street and Georges River Road, with Brighton Avenue, another major north-south traffic routes finishing off to its crossing of the Cooks River.

Illawarra and Southern Sydney

This 'building block' emerges as the one with the largest deficit in projected enrolment. At the 'projection time', the existing eight seats will translate to just 7.46 quotas.

We suggest that that the seat to be abolished should come from this region. By choosing to abolish a seat in the area with a combination of below average enrolment growth and serious shortfalls in projected enrolment in the current seats, this secures minimum disruption to other seats.

Throsby with 92851 electors at the 'projection time' requires no adjustment.

Wollongong and its northern beaches are enjoying less growth than its southern suburbs, which has land release in Shellharbour LGA as a key driver of growth. However, the Illawarra-based LGAs are not large enough to constitute the totality of two seats at the higher projected quota. They must look either north or south. If Throsby moves south, there is major dislocation to the existing pattern of as many as five seats. Yet these seats (Gilmore, Hume, Macarthur, Werriwa, and Fowler) have robust growth and would otherwise require little adjustment.

The proximity of low growth Cook, at the north-eastern end of the Sutherland Shire is also relevant to our reasoning.

On this occasion, we suggest that the adjustments should be made through Hughes across the middle reaches of the Georges River, with an abolition on the northern bank.

Cunningham moves north to take in the outlying southern communities in the Sutherland Shire and the Royal National Park: Bundeena, Maianbar and Waterfall. To reach the minimum permissible enrolment at the 'projection time' it is also necessary to transfer the whole suburb of Heathcote to Cunningham. While it would have been preferable for Heathcote to remain in Hughes, it might be noted that Heathcote is in the same State seat as the northern beachside suburbs of Wollongong as far south as Bulli.

The suburbs of Bonnet Bay, Como, Jannali and Oyster Bay, with their 12825 electors, are transferred to the seat of **Cook**. The Woronora River forms part of the western boundary. We also use the State seat boundary between Miranda and Heathcote (confirmed by the Commissioners after an appeal) between Sutherland and Kirrawee to delineate Hughes and Cook.

Hughes retains 72507 of its existing electors and needs a major addition. We suggest that this be from the western end of Banks: East Hills, Panania, Picnic Point and part of Revesby. East Hills, Panania and Revesby are the three preceding railway stations before Holsworthy (currently in Hughes) when travelling west from the city. Its eastern boundary at this point would be The River Road in its entirety. Stretching from Georges River to Canterbury Road, this road bisects the area and is capable of clear explanation as a boundary in the local community.

Reid has surprisingly robust growth and, although there has been speculation to the contrary, it would seem to be a curious target for abolition. While we suggest it should lose considerable territory and electors to Prospect and Parramatta to facilitate adjustment of northern Sydney seats, our proposal still leaves 55093 of Reid's electors in that seat. Reid gains the Carramar area, west of Prospect Creek, from Fowler and the balance from Blaxland.

The seats we believe should be subject of significant revision are Blaxland, Banks, Watson and Barton.

Other than a small section of South Strathfield, which is transferred to Lowe, the seat of **Blaxland** is effectively divided between Reid and Watson.

The new boundary that we have chosen between Reid and Watson are well-known local roads: the Hume Highway, Edgar Street and Marion Street. Reid gains Chester Hill, Sefton, Birrong, Bass Hill, Georges Hall and Yagoona; Watson gains Greenacre, Punchbowl, Bankstown and Condell Park.

This gives **Watson** a coherence that it currently lacks. It is consolidated as a Canterbury-Bankstown seat, including all of the suburbs served by the Bankstown railway line west of the Cooks River to Bankstown. Watson then loses its St George region component, including Earlwood, Beverly Hills, Kingsgrove and Hurstville to Barton.

We retain the seat name, Watson, despite the fact that our suggested seat has more constituents from the current seat of Blaxland. We believe this is consistent with the policy of naming electoral divisions after former Prime Ministers.

Barton is redrawn as a seat that takes in the whole of Rockdale LGA. Bardwell Park and Bexley North, within Rockdale LGA but currently in Watson, are transferred to Barton. Bexley can now be placed wholly within Barton. The clear western boundary of King Georges Road becomes the western boundary of Barton.

Finally, **Banks** needs to be compensated, having lost 22644 electors at the 'projection time' to Hughes. We reunite the suburbs of Oatley, Mortdale and Penshurst in one federal seat, as was the case prior to the 1992 redistribution. We also transfer Hurstville Grove, South Hurstville, Connells Point, Blakehurst, Carss Park, Kogarah Bay, Allawah and Carlton South to Banks.
