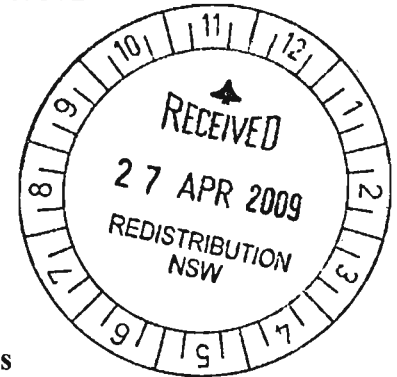

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Dear Members,

Redistribution Proposal for New South Wales

I wish to make a submission to the Committee.

Introduction

In arriving at redistribution options for NSW there are two broad possibilities for abolishing a division, firstly the abolition of a country division or secondly the abolition of a metropolitan division. Presently there is a deficiency in elector numbers in the Illawarra, the central coast/Hunter region, the western country region, the north shore, the inner west of Sydney, and also the Sutherland shire divisions.

On the other hand the north coast divisions with some minor transfers between Cowper and Lyne (and Paterson) would all be within quota. The deficiency in the western country region could be remedied by the restoration of the old Macquarie/Calare boundaries that existed until the last NSW redistribution. Macquarie would be restored to its Blue Mountains Hawkesbury alignment that it had exhibited since the early 1980's. The attraction of the Macquarie option is that it is much less disruptive to divisional boundaries that say abolition of either Parkes or Hunter.

This transfer of the areas to the west of the Great Dividing Range to in large part Calare, would enable a series of adjustments throughout the western country region, the mid west and along the Hume Highway which could remedy elector deficiencies in Gilmore, Throsby and Cunningham.

The boundaries of Lindsay could be adjusted with some additional electors from Macquarie, or remain the same as could Chifley, as both divisions are close to quota and experience reasonable growth. The additional electors from the southern portion of Greenway could remedy voter shortages throughout the divisions of northern Sydney. The electorate of Bennelong could (as it has been in previous redistributions) be displaced further to the west, with the eastern portions transferred to North Sydney.

The divisions of the inner west are projected to be below quota in 2012 (Sydney, Grayndler, Barton, Banks, Blaxland, Lowe, Prospect, Fowler). The remaining divisions of Reid, Watson and Parramatta are projected to be above quota but to minor degrees. The practical effect of the north shore and inner west deficiencies is the need for a westward displacement of divisions.

As a result of my proposals the division to be abolished is Greenway, which is split between, Macquarie, Mitchell, and Lindsay.

My submission is largely in narrative due to imprecision about figures, but I have attached a spreadsheet to summarise the changes in broad terms that I propose.

North Coast

I propose that that no changes be made to the five divisions (Paterson, Lyne, Cowper, Page and Richmond) except for a minor transfer from Cowper to Lyne, as there is a small elector deficiency in Lyne that can be easily remedied. Overall the north coast experiences good growth and being slightly below quota is not problematic.

Central Coast/Hunter region

The electorates of the central coast and Hunter region (Robertson, Dobell, Shortland, Charlton, Newcastle, Hunter) are close to quota and generally experiencing sufficient growth not to require additional electors to maintain quota.

I had considered an option that entailed abolition of Hunter as it is an unusual electorate which is surrounded by the central coast/Hunter region, and neighbouring rural divisions such as New England, Parkes which are well under quota. In addition adjacent to them are other divisions that are well below quota. Whilst this is still a workable option a superior option is restoring Macquarie to a Blue Mountains/Hawkesbury division. Then those electors to the west of the Great Dividing Range are sufficient to remedy the elector deficiency in the states west and south.

Country area

The western part of the state is experiencing lower elector growth than the average. Some minor transfers from Parkes to New England, from Macquarie to Calare allows for surplus electors to be transferred to Parkes, Farrer, Riverina, Hume in sufficient numbers to enable Eden-Monaro to remain unchanged. The practical effect is for Farrer to expand in area, Calare to contract to an area that it has traditionally occupied in the states mid west, Riverina to expand slightly, as does Hume.

Gilmore is the most logical source of electors to remedy an elector deficiency in two slow growing divisions in the Illawarra region (Throsby and Cunningham). This in turn creates a problem for Gilmore, which whilst faster growing than the state average is well below quota. I have proposed a further transfer of about 15,033 (and 16,880 in 2012) electors from the Southern Highlands on the eastern side of the Hume Highway to remedy this deficiency. These transfers from Hume are offset by transfers to Hume from Calare.

Illawarra

I have canvassed the elector deficiency in Throsby and Cunningham and proposed a simple transfer of the remainder of Kiama to Throsby and a small transfer of about 4,000 electors in the Unanderra area to Cunningham.

Eastern Suburbs

The eastern suburbs are tended to lose divisions over time due to the expansion of population elsewhere. Presently both Wentworth and Kingsford-Smith are both above quota and projected to remain there. In 2005 a number of changes were made to boundaries between Sydney, Wentworth and Kingsford-Smith, and whilst some changes might be an option, all three divisions are within quota tolerance and changes would be quite modest. The simplest solution is to make no change to either division (Wentworth or Kingsford-Smith) at this time.

North Shore

Currently Mackellar, Warringah, North Sydney, Berowra, are below quota. Bradfield is on quota and will grow slightly less than the state average, Bennelong whilst above quota will decline overtime. Whilst Mitchell and Greenway are strongly growing.

I have proposed a transfer in the Dee Why area (North Curl Curl, Wingala and Curl Curl) to Mackellar from Warringah. This is a minor change but necessary to maintain Mackellar closer to quota. Some 9,000 electors need to be transferred from North Sydney (in the Willoughby council area, suburbs Northbridge, Castlecrag, North and East Willoughby) to Warringah bring Warringah to slightly over quota (and compensate for the earlier transfer to Mackellar).

North Sydney (given that Bradfield is on quota and leaving it as is, is the easiest option) needs to gain some 13,000 electors in the Ryde area (east of Church St/Develin St including Gladesville, Putney, Ryde and Tennyson Point) from Bennelong. This is the least disruptive to both Bennelong and meets the numerical requirements for North Sydney.

As noted elsewhere Bennelong is moving slowly westwards with each redistribution. I propose to transfer those parts of Baulkham Hills in Parramatta and about 4,500 electors from Parramatta north east to Bennelong. This combines areas of similar socio economic interest and enables the movement of Bennelong to the west which enables transfers from Parramatta to Reid to follow fairly identifiable boundaries (either council boundaries such as including Ermington (from Parramatta council) in Reid), or main roads. Suburbs that will become part of Bennelong include Dundas Valley, Carlingford and Oatlands.

Berowra I have proposed to be supplemented with about 7,000 electors from the east of Mitchell. This is preferable as the faster growth in Mitchell will compensate for the slower growth in Berowra and bring Berowra up to quota.

Western Suburbs (inner and outer)

The restoration of a Macquarie based on the Blue Mountains and Hawkesbury, allows for a series of changes which allows for additional electors to be transferred to Lindsay from Macquarie, for the maintenance of Chifley without changes. Some small changes to Chifley could be made but it is not necessary.

The electors from the southern portion of Greenway in the City of Blacktown I have proposed be incorporated in the Division of Mitchell. The socio-economic characteristics of both areas are similar and both a fast growing areas of outer suburbia. That includes the following suburbs in Mitchell, Marsden Park, Schofields, Quakers Hill, Riverstone, Vineyard, Rouse Hill, The Ponds, Box Hill, Nelson, Annangrove, Kellyville, Kellyville Ridge, Beaumont Hills, Acacia Gardens, Parklea, and Stanhope Gardens.

The alternative arrangement would be to amalgamate the Greenway portion of the City of Blacktown with the portion of Blacktown in Parramatta. Given that Parramatta will shed electors in the east to Bennelong, the reduction of Parramatta would be to such an extent that it would effectively cease to exist. As Parramatta is a federation division and clearly identifiable in terms of locality and name this is far from ideal. Noting though that Parramatta has covered enormous areas in the past, with often little focus on the Parramatta locality.

In the 2005 redistribution there were concerns raised about the fact that the actual core areas of Parramatta would in fact be in Reid. I have arrived at a position unintentionally which exacerbates this situation further. Reid I propose will expand to the west, losing areas to Lowe, Blaxland and gaining areas on the northern side of the Parramatta River including Ermington (placed in Bennelong at the 2005 redistribution), all of Parramatta-inner and Holroyd Council area that is currently in Parramatta. Due to the differential population movements around Sydney, it is difficult to maintain Reid essentially on one side of the Parramatta River, if it is it requires considerable rearrangements of other Divisions. The only portion of Auburn Council that will remain in the revised Reid will be the locality of Auburn itself, and defined roughly by the area west of St Hilliers Rd, Olympic Way, Vaughan St and Wellington Rd, with 22,030 (24,116) electors transferred from the Auburn Council to Blaxland.

Inner suburbs

From the eastern end of the divisions in this region, we have Sydney, which is fast growing but slightly below quota. I have not proposed any changes in view of its high growth and the fact that it remains within tolerance.

The neighbouring Grayndler needs additional electors, I propose that the remainder of the Cities of Canterbury and Ashfield that are within Lowe be transferred, and this is the least disruptive option.

The divisions of Fowler, Banks, Barton, Blaxland, and Prospect are all below quota. The transfers I propose below with Hughes and Macarthur will increase Fowlers numbers.

For Banks, Barton, Watson, there will need to a displacement to the west and north, into Blaxland and a need to move the boundaries into the existing Reid. Whilst Barton and Banks require additional electors might seem easy to accomplish, operating within the combined boundaries of Botany Bay, the Georges River and the Cooks River, the only sources of electors are either Watson, or Blaxland. As well the nature of these incremental changes will become more difficult overtime to sustain, and why I propose a more substantial change in the alignment of divisions.

Watson whilst above quota is experiencing below state average growth. Because of transfers to Grayndler parts of the City of Rockdale to the west of the Sydney-Illawarra railway line could be included in Watson (another former Prime Ministerial name comparatively recently substituted for an existing divisional name St George).

Barton I propose should take in areas from Banks along the Georges River which lie in the City of Hurstville (south of Forest Road), whilst this makes Barton more elongated, it could be reasonably argued that the community of interest and socio-economic characteristics of areas such as Lugarno are reasonably linked to the other coastal areas fronting the Georges River and Botany Bay.

Banks I propose to displace to the north taking in areas from Blaxland. Very large areas of both these electorates are already contained within the City of Bankstown. There is significant community of interest. I have proposed to include those parts of the City of Hurstville that are presently located in Watson. The net effect is to create a more coastal/bay electorate Barton, a division defined by the Cooks River and Sydney-Illawarra railway line, and council boundary of Rockdale and Hurstville (Watson). Banks becomes a more westerly focused electorate which by necessity includes additional electors from Blaxland, from the area east of Stacey St and the Hume Highway (Greenacre and Mount Lewis).

Lowe (McMahon) and Reid

Lowe is already under quota and whilst growing above average, with the transfer to Grayndler I propose a compensatory transfer from Reid, using the western highway including those parts north in the City of Auburn (i.e. Homebush, Newington, Silverwater). This area is growing fairly rapidly and has a community of interest with areas in Lowe. As well I propose to add back those part of the City of Strathfield that is located in Blaxland, and Reid. This electorate was previously represented by a former Prime Minister Sir William McMahon; the Committee may wish to consider renaming the division in his honour. This is the only former deceased Prime Minister not afforded this honour. In addition there are several divisions in several states named after much less long serving prime ministers such as Fadden, Forde, McEwen and Page, and several divisions named after opposition leaders (who did not become Prime Ministers) such as Charlton and Calwell.

The abolition of Reid is a possible solution to accommodate changes elsewhere, although because of movements from Greenway and reconfiguring of Parramatta, Mitchell, etc, the abolition of the name Greenway may be more appropriate and workable. This is a much less longstanding name and whilst Greenway is an appropriate figure to commemorate I understand that precedence is given to former deceased Prime Ministers.

Given the dominance of New South Wales and Victoria as the source of Prime Ministers, the substitution of names may in time be necessary. I note that nearby divisions such as Berowra, Prospect, Warringah are locality names, and examples of names that may in time be replaced by those of former Prime Ministers or prominent people that warrant recognition.

The committee may wish to consider whether the retention of a long standing divisional name, named after former Prime Minister Reid should be retained.

Parramatta area

The Parramatta area is in effect the point of convergence for the changes of divisions on the north shore, inner and outer west and differentials in elector growth.

I have referred to earlier the option for managing the electors from the abolished seat of Greenway and merging with the northern portion of Mitchell. This is a superior option to the alternative of a merger of southern Greenway and western Parramatta in the City of Blacktown, with its consequential effects on Reid and Parramatta.

The existing electorate of Parramatta by changes to surrounding divisions will move northwards. Retaining Reid requires a northerly movement over the Parramatta River; I have proposed the remainder of the City of Holroyd to boost its numbers, and the CBD area (SLAs Parramatta inner) of Parramatta. This means that the proposed Division of Parramatta is very different in character. Its axis will be further north with a substantial number of electors from Baulkham Hills and Blacktown. Some 40% of the revised Parramatta will be from Mitchell.

The suburbs in the revised Parramatta will include Seven Hills, Blacktown, Lalor Park, Kings Langley, Bella Vista, Baulkham Hills, Winston Hills, Castle Hill, Northmead, North Rocks, Toongabbie, Wentworthville,

Southern and south western suburbs

Cook, Hughes are both below quota, whilst a transfer of about 4,000 electors from Hughes to Cook will remedy Cooks shortfall, Hughes already spans the Georges River in the north. I propose to reverse the transfer from the last redistribution where a portion of Fowler was transferred to Hughes in the Liverpool area.

A more workable and better community of interest option would be to have Hughes straddle the Georges River but further south in the area of Glenfield, Macquarie Fields, Ingleburn, Long Point, and possibly Minto, Minto Heights with 16,000 (18,000) electors approximately.

There is already a bridge crossing within Glenfield and both sides of the river are either in the City of Liverpool or the City of Campbelltown. The Liverpool Council boundary could be used as the northern boundary on the western side of the Georges River. The area south of a road and bridge crossing on the Georges River and the eastern area between the railway line and the Georges River will assist maintain elector numbers and have similar socio-economic characteristics. The added attraction of this option is to assist remove excess electors in both Werriwa and Macarthur (which are fast growing divisions) without disrupting further, electors to the north such as Fowler, Blaxland and Reid.

I propose to add to Macarthur a portion of the outer western area of Fowler from Wollondilly, Liverpool and Penrith Councils, which will assist Macarthur numbers, and compensate for the transfers made into Fowler from Hughes. The impact is to make Fowler more compact, and include in Macarthur areas of similar socio-economic and community of interest in the outer urban and semi rural areas west of Camden. Fowler is slower growing than the state average this transfer remedies this shortfall.

With Werriwa, I proposed that the remaining portion of Camden with 1967 (2327) electors be placed in Macarthur, this is a semi rural area more in keeping with the remainder of areas in Macarthur. As well I have proposed that a compensatory transfer of 14,000 (16,000) electors from Macarthur to Werriwa, suburbs such as Campbelltown, Leumeah, Kentlyn, Menangle Park.

This briefly summarises the nature of the changes I propose for divisional boundaries in NSW. The total of elector transfers is 481,393 (10.6% of electors) in 2009 and 519,567(10.9% of electors) in 2012.

Divisions not changed

Richmond, Page, Paterson, Robertson, Dobell, Shortland, Newcastle, Charlton, Hunter, Eden-Monaro, Wentworth, Kingsford-Smith, Chifley, Bradfield.

Divisions with Minor Changes

Lyne, Cowper, Farrer, New England, Lindsay, Mackellar, Prospect, Cook, Sydney, Riverina, Throsby, Cunningham.

Divisions with larger changes

Warringah, North Sydney, Grayndler, Lowe (McMahon), Barton, Watson, Banks, Macarthur, Werriwa, Gilmore, Berowra, Hughes, Hume, Parkes, Calare, Fowler.

Divisions with significant changes

Bennelong, Greenway (abolished), Macquarie, Parramatta, Reid, Mitchell, Blaxland.
