



Electoral enrolment for persons with no fixed address in New South Wales



IMPORTANT — Please read the information on this page before you start to fill in the form

Enrolment and voting

This form is to be used to enrol for federal, state and local government elections by persons who have no fixed address, including homeless persons, itinerant and seasonal workers.

Can you enrol if you have no fixed address?

You are eligible to enrol if you:

- are an Australian citizen, or a British subject who was enrolled on 25 January 1984; and
- are 18 years or older.

You may enrol when you are 17, but you cannot vote until you are 18.

You are not eligible to apply for enrolment under this category if:

- you have a real place of living (i.e. a place to which you intend to return to live, even if you are temporarily living somewhere else).
- you are travelling around Australia on an extended trip, but intend returning to your fixed address.
- you intend leaving Australia for a short period.
- you regularly travel from your fixed address for extended periods in connection with work, such as travelling farm workers, fishing crews, mine workers.

For information on other enrolment options call the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) on **13 23 26**.

Do you have to enrol and vote?

Enrolment and voting are not compulsory for persons with no fixed address. However, if you do enrol and do not vote or apply for a postal vote at an election, your enrolment may be cancelled.

In which electorate can you enrol?

You must select the highest category that applies to you and enrol for the electoral area:

- A** in which you were last eligible to be enrolled (this will generally be the place where you last lived for at least one month),
- B** in which one of your next of kin is currently enrolled if you have not previously been eligible to enrol,
- C** in which you were born if neither of the above apply, or
- D** with which you have the closest connection if you were not born in Australia.

Where do you vote?

- You will be able to vote in federal elections as an ordinary voter at any polling place within the electoral area for which you are enrolled.
- You may also cast an absent vote at any other polling place provided it is within your enrolled state.
- If you are not in the state for which you are enrolled, or if you are unable to attend a polling place on polling day, you may vote at a pre-poll centre, or by post. Postal vote application forms are available from any Australia Post outlet.

Contact any office of the AEC for more information on pre-poll and postal voting.

Change in living arrangements

If you establish a permanent place of living in Australia and live there for a period of one month, you must enrol as an ordinary elector. You can get an enrolment form from any Australia Post outlet or any office of the AEC, or the AEC website at www.aec.gov.au

Who has access to your enrolment information

The general public

The electoral roll can be inspected at any Australian Electoral Commission office or the office of the ACT Electoral Commission. Only names and addresses are provided on the publicly available roll.

The Commonwealth of Australia

Electoral information may be disclosed to persons or organisation as listed in the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918*. These persons or organisations may include –

- Members of Parliament, Senators, registered political parties, and candidates for House of Representatives elections.
- Electoral authorities of states and territories that have a joint roll arrangement with the Commonwealth.
- Approved medical research and public health screening programs.
- Agencies, persons or organisations prescribed in the Electoral and Referendum Regulations 1940, including certain Australian government agencies and particular bodies for identity verification purposes under Commonwealth legislation relating to financial tracing and anti-money laundering.

The State of New South Wales

The New South Wales Electoral Commission provides electoral information including title, name and postal address, date of birth, gender and electoral area to –

- Members of State Parliament and registered political parties
- Groups and candidates participating in the electoral process – date of birth is not provided
- Certain health screening programs – within National Health and Medical Research Council guidelines
- State agencies – including NSW Police, Sheriff's Office, ICAC, Department of Fair Trading, NSW Crime Commission and Office of State Revenue.

Proof of identity

You must prove your identity for electoral enrolment

How do you prove your identity?

- A** If you have an **Australian driver's licence** provide the details at Question 10 on PAGE A2.

You will only need to complete and return PAGE A1 and PAGE A2

- B** If you don't have an Australian driver's licence you need an **authorised person** (see PAGE B) to **sight an original of ONE of the documents listed on PAGE B**.

You will need to complete and return PAGE A1, PAGE A2 and PAGE B

OR

- C** If you don't have an Australian driver's licence AND you don't have any of the documents listed on PAGE B, you need **TWO people who are enrolled and have known you for at least one month to confirm your identity** (see PAGE C).

You will need to complete and return PAGE A1, PAGE A2 and PAGE C
