This guide is only relevant to people who are enrolled to vote in the federal electoral division of Dunkley in Victoria.

DUNKLEY BY-ELECTION 2024

The Dunkley by-election will be held on **Saturday 2 March 2024.** Polling places open at 8am and close at 6pm sharp.

Why?

You will be voting for a representative for the federal electoral division of Dunkley in the House of Representatives. This by-election is being held following the death of the former Member for Dunkley.

Who has to vote?

If you are enrolled in the federal electoral division of Dunkley you are required to vote in the by-election. If you are not sure whether you are enrolled in the division of Dunkley, check your enrolment information at aec.gov.au/check or call 13 23 26 if you need help.

What if I can't make it?

If you can't make it to a polling place on election day, you may be eligible to vote early.

To check if you are eligible to vote at either an early voting centre or by post visit **aec.gov.au/pva**

Voting early in person

If you are eligible, you can vote at an early voting centre (below) from Monday 19 February 2024 to Friday 1 March 2024.

Changes may occur to the information below. Visit **aec.gov.au/dunkley** to see the list of early voting centres and to check opening dates and hours.

Voting early by post

If you are eligible to vote early you can apply for a postal vote online at **aec.gov.au/pva** or by scanning the QR code.

Please call **13 23 26** if you don't have online access and want to apply for a postal vote.



The AEC must receive your application as soon as possible and no later than 6pm AEDT Wednesday 28 February 2024.

Plan ahead before you vote

Do your research on candidates and preferences before you go to vote. A list of the candidates is available at **aec.gov.au/dunkley**

You can take measures to keep yourself and others safe while voting. For the latest health and safety updates and advice visit **aec.gov.au/dunkley**

What happens at the polling place?

Hand sanitiser will be available, and you are encouraged to engage in general hygiene measures such as maintaining physical distance. You can use an AEC pencil, or you can bring your own pencil or pen.

When you reach the ballot paper issuing point, a polling official will ask for your full name and address, and if you have voted before in the 2024 Dunkley by-election. Your name will be marked off the electoral roll.

- You will be given your green ballot paper for the House of Representatives.
- Read the instructions on your ballot paper carefully.
- Complete your ballot paper.
 You must number every box to make your vote count.
- Once you have completed your ballot paper, fold it and place it in the ballot box provided.
- Deposit your AEC pencil in the box on the way out.

Remember, if you need help, you can ask a polling official.

The AEC takes the safety of our voters and election workers seriously and implements appropriate hygiene measures. Information in this guide reflects circumstances at the time of printing.

Where?

You can vote at any polling place in the federal electoral division of Dunkley on election day.

Please note that polling place locations may have changed since you last voted. At the time of printing this publication, the locations of some polling places were yet to be confirmed. Final locations are available at aec.gov.au/dunklev

The final list of polling places, along with a list of candidates, will be published in the *Frankston Times* on Tuesday 27 February, *Herald Sun* and *The Age* on Friday 1 March.

It's important you consider if what you see, hear or read is reliable, from a recognisable source, and is current and safe (not a scam). How to make your vote count

For the Dunkley by-election you will be given a green ballot paper.

You will be voting for a representative for the federal electoral division of Dunkley in the House of Representatives.

Number every box in the order of your choice.

Don't worry if you make a mistake. You can ask for another ballot paper and start again.



You can practise voting at aec.gov.au/ practise



Voting is compulsory for Australian citizens aged 18 years and older. If you don't vote, you may be prosecuted. If you vote more than once it is a criminal offence.
