Re: North Sydney

Realising that the population density of national seats require a boundary adjustment I am writing in favour of maintaining the seat of North Sydney.

1. North Sydney is an historic seat in that it was created at the time of federation.

2. Its boundaries of the main Sydney Harbour and Middle Harbour make it a geographical identifiable electorate. Its inhabitants feel and recognise this.

3. It has a harmonious and diverse constituency that recognises itself within the contact of the state and the nation.

4. The business centres, housing and natural landscapes are interlinked and appreciated by its population.

These reasons alone should be enough to justify its retention.

If boundary adjustments are required to fulfil the Electoral commission's designs then a simple expansion to the east, to include the suburb of Mosman would most likely achieve this. Equally the inclusion of the section of East Roseville that strangely falls in the electorate of Warringah should be incorporated.

This electorate is growing with an increased population due to high-rise living and shared occupation in suburban settings. Both of which may see new boundaries as unnecessary.

Warringah that would be affected by these suggested boundary changes could easily be expanded to the west to satisfy its population requirements.
