**REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED REDISTRIBUTION
OF THE STATE OF QUEENSLAND**

Representation of Queensland in the House of Representatives

1. On 19 February 2003 the Electoral Commissioner made a determination of State and Territory representation entitlements under section 48(1) of the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918* (the Act). Under the determination, Queensland is entitled to 28 Members of the House of Representatives, one more than its previous entitlement.

Direction for a redistribution of Queensland Electoral Divisions

2. Section 59(2) of the Act provides that a redistribution shall be directed whenever a determination under section 48(1) of the Act results in an alteration of the number of members of the House of Representatives to be chosen in a State. As a consequence of the determination referred to in paragraph 1, on 12 March 2003, the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) directed by notice published in the Gazette that a redistribution was to commence in Queensland.
3. At the end of 12 March 2003, the day determined by the Electoral Commission for the redistribution to begin, the number of electors enrolled for the State was 2,354,176 (Table 1).
4. Redistribution 2003 Statistics which show the electoral enrolment figures as at 12 March 2003 were made available on Compact Disc and on the AEC website. In addition, copies were printed upon request at all Queensland AEC offices. The statistics were given at the following levels:
 - Census Collector District (CCD)
 - Statistical Local Area (SLA)
 - Electoral Division
 - State

Quota

5. Under Section 65(2) of the Act, the Electoral Commissioner determined that the quota of electors for Queensland was 84,078 (2,354,176 divided by 28 Members). Thus, the permitted range of the margin of allowance of 10% below and above the quota would be 75,671 to 92,485 respectively. In making its proposals for the State, the Redistribution Committee is not permitted to exceed that range.

Enrolment projections

6. Section 66(3)(a) of the Act requires the Committee to "...as far as practicable, endeavour to ensure that, if the State or Territory were redistributed in accordance with the proposed redistribution, the number of electors enrolled in each Electoral Division in the State or Territory would not, at the projection time determined under Section 63A, be less than 96.5% or more than 103.5% of the average divisional enrolment of that State or Territory at that time...".
7. The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) supplied enrolment projections to the AEC using AEC enrolment data as the base and a cohort-component method to project the enrolment of each Census Collector District (CCD) to 31 July 2007, that is, three years and six months after the expected date of the final determination of boundaries (Table 2). Divisional Returning Officers (DROs) of the Australian Electoral Commission examined the ABS projections in the light of their local knowledge and experience, and where appropriate, substituted their own projections, as noted in the Joint Standing Committee on Electoral Matters December 1995 Report on the Effectiveness and Appropriateness of the Redistribution Provisions of the CEA. DROs made use of information supplied by relevant Local Authority planning and statistical groups, as well as their own resources in undertaking this task. The Australian Electoral Officer for Queensland also reviewed the projections.
8. The projections were made available on Compact Disc and on the AEC website to persons or organisations interested in using them as an indication of the likely growth of elector enrolment and as an aid to the preparation of Public Suggestions or Comments on Public Suggestions. In addition, copies were printed upon request at all Queensland AEC offices.
9. The projected total enrolment for Queensland at 31 July 2007 will be 2,621,489. Thus, the average enrolment of the 28 Divisions at that time would be 93,625 and the 3.5% tolerance above and below that average require that Divisions be constructed in the range between 90,349 and 96,901 electors (Table 3).

Appointment of the Redistribution Committee for Queensland

10. In accordance with Section 60 of the Act, the AEC appointed the Redistribution Committee for Queensland on 2 June 2003.

11. The Redistribution Committee (the Committee) consists of the following members:

12. Members of the Committee met to discuss preliminary matters on 8 June 2003. Formal discussions were held on 16 July, 5 August and 6 August 2003.

Invitation to submit Public Suggestions and Comments

13. In accordance with Section 64 of the Act the Electoral Commissioner invited written Public Suggestions and written Comments on those Suggestions by notice published in the Gazette on 21 May 2003, and in The Courier Mail and The Sunday Mail newspapers on 24 May 2003 and 25 May 2003 respectively.

Statutory requirements for the making of a proposed redistribution

16. Section 66(1) of the Act requires the Redistribution Committee for Queensland to make a proposed redistribution of the State.

17. Sections 66(3) and 66(3A) of the Act prescribe that:

(3) *In making the proposed redistribution, the Redistribution Committee:*

(a) *shall, as far as practicable, endeavour to ensure that, if the State or Territory were redistributed in accordance with the proposed redistribution, the number of electors enrolled in each Electoral Division in the State or Territory would not, at the projection time determined under Section 63A, be less than 96.5% or more than 103.5% of the average divisional enrolment of that State or Territory at that time; and*

(b) *subject to paragraph (a), shall give due consideration, in relation to each proposed Electoral Division, to:*

(i) *community of interests within the proposed Electoral Division, including economic, social and regional interests;*

(ii) *means of communication and travel within the proposed Electoral Division;*

...

- (iv) *the physical features and area of the proposed Electoral Division; and*
- (v) *the boundaries of existing Divisions in the State or Territory;*

and subject thereto the quota of electors for the State or Territory shall be the basis for the proposed redistribution, and the Redistribution Committee may adopt a margin of allowance, to be used whenever necessary, but in no case shall the quota be departed from to a greater extent than one-tenth more or one-tenth less.

- (3A) *When applying subsection (3), the Redistribution Committee must treat the matter in subparagraph (3)(b)(v) as subordinate to the matters in subparagraphs (3)(b)(i), (ii) and (iv).*

Community of Interests, Means of Communication and Travel, Physical Features and Existing Boundaries

- 18. The criteria set out in Section 66(3)(b) of the Act – community of interests, means of communication and travel, physical features and area, and boundaries of existing Divisions – are subordinate to the two objectives of enrolments in proposed Divisions being within a range of 3.5% above or below the average divisional enrolment at the projection time and current enrolments being within 10% above or below the quota. However, notwithstanding these overriding constraints, the Committee sought to ensure that the other criteria were given maximum possible consideration, also bearing in mind that the criterion to give regard to the boundaries of existing Divisions is subordinate to the other criteria. Within the constraints imposed by the numerical criteria and the other considerations, the Committee adopted the view that it is highly desirable that electoral boundaries be readily recognisable. Accordingly, the Committee was guided by Local Government boundaries, locality boundaries, main roads, railways, waterways and other linear features as boundaries, wherever possible.

Public Suggestions and Comments

- 19. When the period for the receipt of Public Suggestions closed on Friday, 20 June 2003, the Committee had received twenty-nine Public Suggestions. In accordance with the Act, copies of these were made available for perusal at the office of the Australian Electoral Officer for Queensland from Monday, 23 June 2003. Public Suggestions were also made available on the AEC website.

20. Public Suggestions covering the whole of the State were received from four organisations and one individual. The remaining twenty-four Public Suggestions related to parts of the State, specific locality issues and potential names for a new Division.
21. The provision of current and projected enrolment figures on Compact Disc and on the AEC website, plus the provision of these on request, facilitated this process as the detailed Public Suggestions took into account the numerical criteria.
22. The Committee received fourteen Comments relating to the Public Suggestions by the close of the Comments period on 4 July 2003. The Comments on Public Suggestions were made available to members of the public for perusal at the office of the Australian Electoral Officer for Queensland and were also made available on the AEC website.
23. As required by Section 64(4) of the Act the Committee considered all of the Public Suggestions and Comments on Suggestions lodged. In addition, one Comment lodged after the statutory period was provided to the Committee for their information.

Names of proposed Divisions

24. Naming of Federal Divisions has been the subject of a number of recommendations from Parliamentary Committees. The subject was dealt with most recently by the 1995 Inquiry of the Joint Standing Committee on Electoral Matters. From these recommendations, there has been developed a set of guidelines or conventions that have been used by Redistribution Committees. These guidelines were offered to interested persons in the advertising of this redistribution.

Technical procedures

25. The Australian Electoral Commission maintains the electoral roll on the basis of alignment to CCDs, and thus is able to provide statistical data on enrolments and projected enrolments on this basis. Accordingly, in formulating its proposals, the Committee used the CCDs as the basic building block. The State is divided into 7215 CCDs as used at the 2001 Census of Population and Housing. The CCDs each have defined boundaries and are of differing sizes and shapes. In several cases, where the Committee considered that a particular CCD boundary was inappropriate for an Electoral Division boundary, the CCD was split to provide a more useful boundary, in line with the criteria outlined in paragraphs 17 and 18.
26. As an aid to the testing of various boundary options, the Committee used the AEC Electoral Boundary Mapping System (EBMS) which was developed within the proprietary "MapInfo Professional" software package (Version 7.0). EBMS was also made available for public use at the office of the Australian Electoral Commission, Level 7, Collection House, 488 Queen St, Brisbane.

Existing Divisions

27. At the time of striking the quota, the 2007 enrolment projections for each Division varied markedly across the State. Enrolment projections for six Divisions were within the statistical tolerance (+/- 3.5%) as specified in Section 66(3) of the Act. Of these Divisions, three were metropolitan Divisions, namely, Lilley, Oxley and Rankin and three Divisions were provincial and/or rural in character, namely Dawson, Groom and Leichhardt.
28. The enrolment projections for six Divisions were below the statistical tolerance of -3.5%. All were provincial and/or rural Divisions namely Blair, Capricornia, Hinkler, Kennedy, Maranoa and Wide Bay.
29. The enrolment projections for fifteen Divisions were above the statistical tolerance of +3.5%. Of these Divisions eight were metropolitan Divisions, namely Bowman, Brisbane, Dickson, Fadden, Griffith, Moreton, Petrie and Ryan, and seven Divisions were provincial and/or rural in character, namely Fairfax, Fisher, Forde, Herbert, Longman, McPherson and Moncrieff.

General Strategy

30. In fulfilling its statutory duty, the Committee was mindful of areas of population growth and decline, limitations posed by major geographical features and State borders, and guided by boundaries of a municipal district, wherever possible, as indicators of community of interests.
31. The Committee also sought to achieve as little disruption as possible to electors in proposing new electoral boundaries. This proposal results in 1 in 6 electors changing Division – compared to 1 in 7.5 at the 1997 redistribution and 1 in 6 at the 1994 redistribution.
32. The Committee noted the comparatively large growth projected for those Divisions having inner and outer metropolitan characteristics – foreshadowing a need to address quite closely not only the changing nature of the Brisbane CBD, but also, the newer outer suburbs and satellite cities. It also noted the comparatively large growth projected for provincial electorates most notably those covering the Gold Coast and Sunshine Coast.
33. The Committee also noted the low level of projected growth in rural and provincial Divisions. In large part, the Committee was left with no alternative but to excise significant territory from adjoining Divisions in order to meet the required statistical tolerances under the Act.
34. A key indicator of community of interests as defined by LGA boundaries was used in provincial and/or rural Queensland to a significant extent. In metropolitan Divisions, it was used to the greatest extent possible. The Committee was able to accommodate boundaries of most LGAs entirely within a single Division. Only rural boundaries of eight-LGAs could not be accommodated within a single electoral Division and these generally reflect existing boundaries.

Proposed Redistribution of Queensland

35. As previously mentioned, wherever possible the Committee aligned proposed Division boundaries to boundaries of LGAs, which resulted in a number of changes. Significant changes are referred to in the following report. For all changes affecting a particular Division, please refer to the Table Section at the end of this report.

Rural and Provincial Queensland (including the proposed Divisions of Capricornia, Dawson, Groom, Herbert, Hinkler, Kennedy, Leichhardt, Maranoa and Wide Bay)

36. The Committee considered that there were minimal changes required in North Queensland to satisfy Section 66 of the Act. It proposed that the existing boundaries of Dawson and Leichhardt are not altered.
37. To meet the statistical requirements of the Act it was proposed that an additional portion of the City of Thuringowa be moved to Kennedy from Herbert. This would cause minimal disruption to electors in these two divisions and continues a trend from previous redistributions.
38. The Committee received several suggestions addressing the issue of which division should contain Palm Island. This issue has been addressed by previous Redistribution Committees and the Committee proposed that the provisions of Section 66 (3)(b) of the Act are best served by retaining Palm Island in Herbert.
39. The Committee examined the movement of other LGAs within these areas and proposed that the requirements of Section 66 (3)(b) of the Act would be best served by linking the Shires of Banana, Mount Morgan and Duaringa to the proposed Capricornia and uniting all of the Shire of Fitzroy in the proposed Capricornia.
40. The Committee received several suggestions pertaining to the linking of various LGAs to provincial centres. The Committee proposed that the Shires of Kolan and Perry should be linked with the proposed Hinkler as requested in several suggestions.
41. It also recognised a road network linking the Shires of Monto, Eidsvold, Gayndah and Mundubbera that links to Bundaberg. Accordingly these Shires were placed in the proposed Hinkler.
42. At the time of striking a quota, Capricornia and Maranoa had the lowest growth rates within the State viz 3.43% and 3.59% respectively. The statistical requirements of Section 66 (3)(a) of the Act gave the Committee no alternative other than to place more LGAs in the proposed Maranoa to meet the numerical requirements. Accordingly, the Shires of Aramac, Barcaldine, Ilfracombe, Jericho, Longreach, Peak Downs and Winton were added to the proposed Maranoa.

43. Given the decisions to move several LGAs from Wide Bay to the proposed Hinkler and in line with the philosophy of maintaining whole LGAs wherever possible, the Committee was able to reunite the Shire of Cooloola in the proposed Wide Bay.
44. The Committee recognised that the Division of Groom met the requirements of Section 66 (3) of the Act and no changes were proposed.

**Sunshine Coast
(including the proposed Divisions of Fairfax, Fisher and Longman)**

45. Enrolment projections for this area remain among the highest in the State and mandate large changes. Primarily the area is contained in the Shires of Caboolture, Cooloola, Maroochy and Noosa and the City of Caloundra.
46. In its approach to Wide Bay, the Committee placed all of the Shire of Cooloola in Wide Bay. After this occurred, the remaining electors in Fairfax, Fisher and Longman were sufficient in total to comprise three electoral divisions.
47. To meet the statistical requirements of Section 66 of the Act, the proposed Fairfax needed to acquire more of the Shire of Maroochy from Fisher.
48. The proposed Fisher then needed to gain more of the City of Caloundra from Longman.

**Gold Coast
(including the proposed Divisions of McPherson, Moncrieff and Fadden)**

49. The City of Gold Coast currently has enough electors to warrant more than three divisions and the Committee proposed to have three divisions entirely encompassed in the City of Gold Coast by changing the existing boundaries as little as possible.
50. The Committee received a suggestion to bring Forde into the urban areas of the City of Gold Coast effectively linking the Shire of Beaudesert and the City of Gold Coast. The Committee perceived the Gold Coast Hinterland as a natural limitation for the divisions in the west and rejected this suggestion.
51. It is proposed that the boundary of McPherson be retained as much as possible with the excision of a strip of coastal area to the proposed Moncrieff.
52. The proposed Moncrieff needs to accept the excess electors from McPherson and lose numbers in its northern areas to meet statistical requirements.

53. The proposed Fadden accepts the electors displaced by the contraction of McPherson and Moncrieff and is able to accept most of the City of Gold Coast bounded by the seashore, Pacific Motorway and the northern Boundary of the City of Gold Coast. As this is one of the fastest growing areas within Queensland and to meet statistical requirements, some western areas of the City of Gold Coast between Coomera and Nerang were also added to the proposed Fadden.

**Greater Metropolitan Area
(including the proposed Divisions of, Bowman, Brisbane, Griffith, Lilley,
Moreton, Oxley, Petrie, Ryan and Rankin.)**

54. The contraction of the proposed Fadden to be a solely City of Gold Coast Division allowed the proposed Bowman to accept the part of the Shire of Redland not previously within its boundaries. To meet statistical requirements a small portion of the City of Logan was also included in the proposed Bowman.
55. The Committee acknowledged that the large growth occurring within the CBD of the City of Brisbane had made Brisbane grow to be the second largest division numerically in Queensland at the date of setting the quota. The Committee, in turn, recognised the need for the proposed Brisbane to return to the north of the Brisbane River and for the areas vacated on the south to be transferred to the proposed Griffith.
56. The Committee also agreed that the proposed Rankin should include that area of Fadden in the City of Logan apart from the small area needed to meet statistical requirements in the proposed Bowman. In addition the proposed Rankin required a small portion of the City of Brisbane in order to meet statistical requirements for the proposed Rankin.
57. The proposed Griffith would move into those areas of Brisbane vacated south of the Brisbane River and thus contract from areas in the east.
58. The proposed Moreton gains from Rankin in the City of Brisbane and moves to the western side of the South East Freeway.
59. To meet the statistical requirements of Section 66 of the Act and to accommodate the changes described above the Committee had to make changes to the divisions of Lilley, Oxley, Petrie and Ryan.
60. The proposed Oxley gains portions of the City of Brisbane from both Ryan and Moreton. Consequently the boundary between the proposed Blair and proposed Oxley moves eastward in the City of Ipswich.

61. Suggestions were received on how best to deal with that part of Ryan south of the Brisbane River. Numerical considerations did not allow for all of the area to be removed from Ryan and the Committee considered it appropriate that the area west of the Centenary Highway remain in the proposed Ryan. The proposed Ryan gained all of the area of the City of Brisbane on its western boundary, currently located in Blair. To accommodate other changes in Brisbane, the proposed Ryan gained areas from Brisbane's southwest and west.
62. The proposed Brisbane gained the portion of the City of Brisbane in Dickson and a southern portion of Petrie.
63. The proposed Lilley gained a small portion from Petrie allowing the boundary between the two divisions to only change marginally, along Webster Rd.
64. As a result of the above changes the proposed Petrie was defined by a loss to both the proposed Brisbane and the proposed Lilley.

New Division of Bonner

65. The Committee proposed that the new division, to be named Bonner, should contain parts of the City of Brisbane from the divisions of Bowman, including Moreton Island, Fadden, Griffith and Moreton.
66. A number of suggestions and comments were received dealing with possible names for the new division. The Committee proposed the name Bonner in recognition of the service rendered by Neville Thomas Bonner AO as a Senator and leader of indigenous Australians.
67. Neville Thomas Bonner was born on Ukerebagh Island, in the mouth of the Tweed River, northern New South Wales on 28 March 1922. His mother, an aboriginal woman, was not allowed to go to hospital for his birth. He never knew his father. At about five years of age he left the island to live with his grandparents in a camp near Lismore in the Northern Rivers region of New South Wales. His grandmother insisted that he spoke properly and that he learned to read and write. He attended school for only one year from 14 to 15 years of age.
68. In the 1930s in New South Wales he worked around the Northern Rivers district on banana plantations and as a bean and corn picker. When he was 18 he joined a ring barking and scrub felling camp in Queensland. He became well known as a roughrider and took part in rodeos, buck-jumping and bullock riding. Working as stockman he eventually became head stockman at Mount Emu Plains station.
69. In 1946 he and his family moved to join his wife's people on Palm Island, in north Queensland. He lived there for 17 years and formed a number of committees and rose to the position of Assistant Settlement Overseer responsible for the administration of works.

70. The family left Palm Island in 1960 to settle in Ipswich. He became a member of the board of directors of the One People Australia League (OPAL) in 1965 and its Queensland president in 1970 serving until 1976. He was awarded life membership in 1979.
71. He joined the Liberal party in 1967 and by 1969 he was the Oxley Electorate Committee chairman. In 1970 he became an endorsed Senate candidate but was unsuccessful as number 3 on a joint Liberal-Country Party ticket. He was chosen to fill a Senate vacancy created by the resignation of Dame Annabelle Rankin in June 1971, thus becoming the first aboriginal person to sit in Federal Parliament. He continued as a Senator until 1983.
72. Whilst in the Senate he was elected Senate Deputy Chairman of Committees and also served on the Joint Parliamentary Publication Committee, Senate Standing Committee on Social Welfare, Regulations and Ordinances Committee, the Joint House Committee, the Senate's Aboriginal Affairs, Federal Affairs and Health and Welfare Committees. He became the first aboriginal person to introduce legislation and also the first backbencher to introduce a Government Bill and carry it through all stages.
73. In 1979 he was chosen as Australian of the Year. After leaving the Senate he continued in public life serving on the board of directors of the Australian Broadcasting Corporation from 1983 to 1991. In 1984 he was awarded the title Officer of the Order of Australia. He became patron or member of a number organisations and involved himself with education institutions across Australia, lecturing in an honorary capacity. His publications include Black Power in Australia, Equal World – Equal Share and For the Love of Children. From 1992 to 1996 he was member of the Griffith University Council and chairman of the university's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Advisory Council. The university awarded him an honorary doctorate in 1993. In 1998 he returned to Canberra for the Constitutional Convention on behalf of the Australians for a Constitutional Monarchy.
74. Neville Bonner was an elder of the Jagera people. He died on 5 February 1999 at Ipswich.

**Outer Metropolitan Area
(Including the proposed Blair, Dickson and Forde)**

75. Various suggestions and comments were received concerning Blair. The Committee was mindful of the arguments presented but given the requirements of the Act and the proposed boundaries detailed above, the proposed Blair could only meet its numerical requirements by gaining part of the City of Ipswich from Oxley.
76. Changes proposed by the Committee to Brisbane allowed the proposed Dickson to be a division wholly contained in the Shire of Pine Rivers with only that part of the LGA east of the Bruce Highway remaining in another division, Petrie.

77. The Committee was able to limit changes to Forde such that it lost part of the City of Gold Coast to the proposed Fadden, thus allowing the proposed Fadden to be wholly contained in the City of Gold Coast. The proposed Forde gains some parts of the Shire of Boonah from Blair and Oxley allowing all of that LGA, after external boundary changes, to be located in the proposed Forde.
78. The Committee's deliberations resulted in all existing divisions being identified with proposed divisions. In the Committee's view no existing divisions warranted a change of name.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE MANNER IN WHICH EACH PROPOSED DIVISION HAS BEEN CONSTITUTED

The tables in the following pages set out how each proposed Division is constituted and are arranged under Statistical Local Areas (SLAs). Each SLA comprises a number of CCDs which applied at the 2001 Census of Population and Housing.

2 The SLA is the most widely used unit in the presentation of census data and collectively covers the whole of Queensland without gaps or overlaps. SLAs correspond, in the majority of cases, to Local Government Areas (LGAs). Where a particular LGA is substantially different from the general run of LGAs in terms of size and economic significance, the LGAs can be split into a number of SLAs; a case in point is the City of Brisbane, which covers a large area and is split into some 173 SLAs. For reasons of availability of data, the SLAs used for this redistribution are those in place at the 2001 Census.
