

Dear Committee,

I am a born & bred Mudgee person and strongly object to the abolition of the Federal seat of Gwydir.

It is well established that Rural voters are more familiar with and use their Political representatives more than city-based voters and their MPs.

Does it make sense that Gwydir is some 185,000 square kilometres of northern inland NSW. To have this area absorbed into the existing seat of Parkes is ridiculous and ludicrous.

We the country or people in this area of Gwydir have a democratic right to be represented and this would not be the case if this proposed abolishment of the seat of Gwydir occurred.

Would a 380,000 sq Kilometre or an astonishing 47% of the state of NSW be a just representation of rural NSW, expecting one "lucky" MP to look after the interests of unlucky voters spread over 380,000 Kms?
