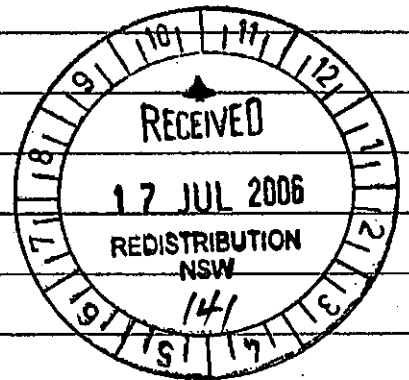

I wish to state my absolute objection to the Federal electoral redistribution of New South Wales affecting the electorate of Guyra.
