

The Redistribution Committee for the Proposed Redistribution of New South Wales into Electoral Divisions.

Objection to the section of the proposal dealing with the proposed changes to the electorates of Macquarie and Calare.

From: WS Gates ATCS, BA, Litt.B, MA Lecturer in Spatial Information Systems at Charles Sturt University (Retired).

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Since my retirement I have involved myself in local government matters and am an active member of the Bathurst Ratepayers' Association. I must point out that though members of the Association have discussed this proposed redistribution that this submission is not formally from the association.

I have studied the proposals which have been put forward to the redistribution committee from various individuals and political groups and following discussion with a number of colleagues I have formed the view that the reduction in the number of distinctly 'rural' seats is not warranted especially as the Committee's proposals will produce a huge unwieldy electorate covering a very large area of the State which would be a physical impossibility for any one person to effectively represent and that a significantly rural electorate of Calare will be split so that one part will become a part of an outer metropolitan seat with the remainder being added to another rural electorate.

I have formed the view that the proposal put forward by the present member for Calare, Mr Peter Andren, represents a more balanced viewpoint than that proposed by the Committee because it makes a sound attempt at representing more effectively what I might term 'rural communities of interest'.

Splitting of Bathurst Regional Council Area.

One of the most unacceptable items in the Committee's proposals was the splitting of the Bathurst Regional Council Area into two. One part to be attached to the proposed Calare electorate and the other part to be attached to the proposed Macquarie electorate.


Increasingly local government has to deal not only with State instrumentalities but with Federal ones as well. To have one local government area dealing with two separate representatives is seen as being both inefficient and unacceptable.

Water Interests

The whole matter of water control and management relates to catchment areas which all drain to the West and into the Murray Darling Basin. The commonality of interest demonstrated by this management of an increasingly scarce resource clearly shows that an electorate with a largely rural basis would be more satisfactory for the Bathurst region than one which is based on an outer metropolitan area which drains to the Warragamba area and essentially supplies Sydney. There is no commonality of interest in this respect!

Local Government.

The local government areas of Bathurst, Cabonne, Orange, Blayney, Wellington and Cowra, and to a marginal extent that of Lithgow have many areas of commonality of interest and, since the amalgamation efforts of some years ago have begun to cooperate more. In so doing their areas of commonality of interest are being developed. There is little need to develop close ties with councils in areas further to the East as the interests each represents to the East are quite distinct and different from those of the councils listed above, to the West.



Catchment Area

The Bathurst Region is part of the Central West Catchment Area which in turn is part of the Murray Darling Basin Area. The Macquarie River flows North West. The whole of the vegetation management programs deal with vegetation which is typically focused on the Bathurst region and further west. There is little in common with Blue Mountains and Springwood vegetation in management terms. The commonality of interest in terms of vegetation management lies within the common catchment and not within the Blue Mountains.

Bushfire Management

Though Bushfire is largely controlled from Sydney there is considerable autonomy granted to the Oberon Area which in turn controls the activities of bushfire brigades throughout the Central West Catchment area. There seems to be little commonality in bushfire control between the Central West Control regime and that which operates further East.

Conclusion:

Commonality of interest for the Bathurst Region lies to the West, not to the East. This commonality of interest has been described in the areas of Water, Catchment Management, Bushfire Management, Local Government, and in the unbalanced distribution of voters the majority of whom have a metropolitan focus with the clear minority of rural voters being essentially cut off from their enjoyment of effective representation.

I would urge the Commission to very strongly support the proposal put forward by Mr Andren. I chose Mr Andren's proposal as being fair and capable of representing rural interests which, the proposals from the major political parties, in my view were unable to effectively support.

I would be pleased to discuss these matters more fully with the Commission.
