Dear Committee members,,

I am writing to express my grave concern about the proposal to abolishthe electorate of Gwydir, and merge it into the seat of Parkes, and I wish to register my strong objection to such a move. The obvious disadvantages of such a move are many, and it is hard to comprehend why such a proposal ever arose in the first place. It would mean the loss of a rural seat in the Australian Parliament, the loss of a voice for regional Australia, it would create a huge and unmanageable electorate of Parkes, where one member could not possibly provide fair and adequate representation for the many local government areas included in the proposed new electorate— in short, it is a proposal that the people of Gwydir do not want.

If a merger of any electorates is necessary, why not consider those in the Sydney area? They smaller and closer together, and a merger there would not cause nearly as much disruption as the abolishment of Gwydir. As a member of the rural and regional community of Australia, I am appealing to you to reconsider this proposal, and to request that the draft boundaries be redrawn.
