

Dear Sir

I am writing to complain about your proposal to put the Federal seats of Gwydir and Parkes together. This would be end up being 47% of the states area and 379,474 square kilometres. I feel that it would be a physically impossible job for any person to adequately represent the people of such a large area no matter what the population spread would be.

This merger would reduce the voice of country people who have little voice at the moment and the people of the electorate would not see their federal member very often, if at all.
