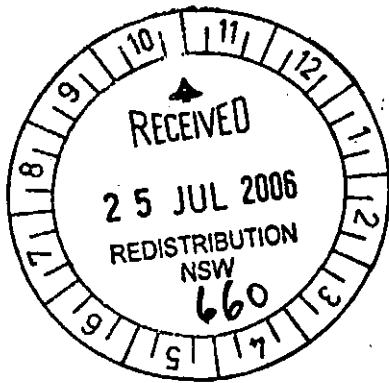

RE. PROPOSED ABOLITION OF GWYDIR ELECTORATE

Firstly, how many of your committee live in a rural area? How many of you realise the importance of a rural area? Without the population in your rural areas you would not be able to easily access wheat, rice, cotton, wool, vegetable oils, meat, milk, minerals etc. which provide your sustenance and comfort.

Those of us who reside to the west of the dividing range have little access to communication with government officials to put our experience of local conditions to the fore, and now you are expecting many of us to lose the little we have by abolishing our access to parliamentary representatives by deleting the seat of Gwydir.
