Objection to proposed changes to Federal Electorate Boundaries of Parkes, Gwydir and Farrer.

Has the Australian Electoral Commission considered the ramifications of their proposed changes to the above electorates?

By implementing the proposed changes the then new electorate of Parkes would cover 47.3 per cent of New South Wales an unmanageable size for any Parliamentarian to service. This proposed electorate is based on population and not equity of representation. This centric approach is at the expense of rural and regional New South Wales.giving the people just a 28 per cent of the States voting power. Is this a fair deal?

Would it not be fairer to abolish one of the Sydney seats where the distance to see your Member of Parliament is minimum? People in the new proposed electorate will have very great distances to travel to have the same privileges as their city cousins.

Please take into account the down turn of rural commodities due to the prolonged drought, the worst in a century. Many families and workers with their families have had to seek employment else where, and hopefully this will change when the drought breaks and irrigation dams are replenished enabling rural areas to be viable and workers and their families will be sort again.
