

In regards to the proposed abolition of the Gwydir Electorate

As a constituent of the seat of Gwydir I am shocked and angry that the amalgamation of Gwydir with Parkes can even be thought, and I strongly object to any such move.

It takes away the right for a vast many of NSW Rural people that live west of the Great Dividing Range to have a meaningful voice in our parliament. Urban constituents have daily access to their members, both sitting & opposing — constituents in the proposed Parkes electorate would virtually have no contact at all.

The situation would be totally ludicrous — to think one person can fairly cover and represent an area five times larger than Tasmania, on isolated roads (often unsealed) with non existent public transport and a poorer health system is just ridiculous and stupidity gone wrong.

Given Tasmania is guaranteed five representatives, the notion of distribution on a population base is just as much nonsense—to equal that, then why are you not creating three new seats, i.e. Parkes, Gwydir and 3 other seats to cover the same area.

The people of country NSW deserve to have a realistic and practical sized Electorate which gives them reasonable access to their member.
