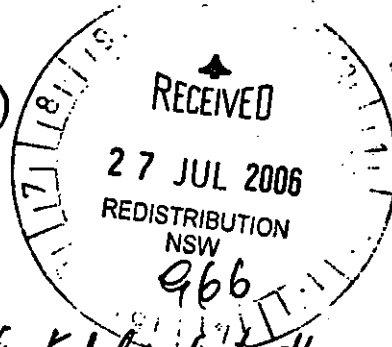

I would like to object to the abolition of the Seat of Gwyddel and in its stead the creation of the new seat of Tashers for the following reasons. (1) There is practically no common denominator between the far west semi arid grazing areas of the Tashers electorate and the more easterly division of high farming production of Gwyddel. In fact most of these areas have no common sporting, recreation or business associations + consequently will be very much opposed in their quests for representation.

The worst roads are not sealed & the distances great, a huge disadvantage is being placed on the calling people to be able to access their representative as & when.

The high costs of fuel & time also impact on the electorate & put the country people at great disadvantage to city people who are served by public transport - broken down as it may be - sealed roads and a representative who can be contacted either on the way to work or on the way home.
