I write to you in response to the article in the Land newspaper regarding the prospect of the loss of another rural seat.

I have lived in the Parkes former Gwydir electorate for over 25 years and given the difficulties we already experience, the prospect of losing representation for this area leaves me disillusioned and greatly disappointed.

Given it is a personal choice to reside in any location, and despite the challenges, rural life is rich, rewarding and worthwhile. Would it not be a reasonable expectation in a democratic society to expect that you are entitled to receive or be able to access a member of Parliament for either state or federal matters within your region?
