If you don't have a permanent home, you have the same right to enrol and vote as every other Australian citizen.

You must enrol to be able to vote in a federal election. If you are experiencing homelessness or living in temporary accommodation there are options for you to enrol.

Why should I enrol?

You must enrol to be able to vote in a federal election. When you enrol, your name will be added to the electoral roll. This is the list of citizens who can vote in an election.

Once you are enrolled, you will be able to use your enrolment as points towards proof of identity requirements.

How do I enrol?

If you do not have a home or you are living in temporary accommodation you can enrol as a voter with no fixed address.

The no fixed address enrolment form is available at **www.aec.gov.au** or at any AEC office.

Will I get fined if I don't enrol?

You will not be fined if you haven't enrolled or voted in the past.

The AEC wants to help every eligible Australian to enrol and vote.

Will my details be made public?

Your details won't be available on the public electoral roll if you enrol as a voter with no fixed address.
