The Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) has received the following application for registration as a political party under the provisions of the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918* (Electoral Act).

Dai Le & Frank Carbone Network's application included: a letter from Ms Dai Le MP supporting its registration; that it wishes to receive election funding; a copy of its constitution; and payment of the \$500 application fee.

You may lodge an objection to the application from Dai Le & Frank Carbone Network under the following grounds in the Electoral Act:

- the application does not relate to an eligible political party;
- the application is not in accordance with section 126; or
- the application should be refused under section 129.

Objections must be received by the AEC by **Friday, 9 June 2023**, must address the relevant criteria above, be in writing and include your name, a street address, signature and the grounds for your objection. Objections can be sent to:
