



Hi,

I wish to object to the registration of the "Fraser Anning Conservative National Party".

Section 129 1 ad of the Electoral Act 1918 states that a party name can not be registered where the name "is one that a reasonable person would think suggests that a connection or relationship exists between the party and a registered party if that connection or relationship does not in fact exist".

The use of Conversative and National in the party name is misleading. The National Party has a history of supporting conservative policies. Some voters may reasonably assume that the Conservative Nationals are associated with the National Party. Further some voters may believe that the party is associated with Australian Conservatives.

Mr Anning should find a more appropriate name for his party. The name should not suggest a connection with an existing party.
