## I am taking this opportunity to comment on the SA Labor Party's objection to maintain the boundaries of the seat of Boothby as they currently stand.

One more time, I would like to inform you of my displeasure with the proposed changes. Our suburb, Happy Valley, has a greater relationship and common issues with the neighbouring suburbs of Marion and Blackwood, that with the suburbs further south of Hackham West and Morphet Vale.

I believe we share the same values of being hardworking, ambitious, driven people. Our suburbs take pride in our achievements and in the community groups that we have built together.
