In 1981 a Trust known as the N.P.A. Vic Settlement was established. The beneficiaries of the Settlement are those persons who are full financial members of the National Party of Australia - Victoria, in accordance with its Constitution and Rules and who are over the age of eighteen years. The Settlement derives income primarily by way of commissions on N.I.A./CGU Insurance business transacted with members of the Party.

The amount distributed to each beneficiary from the net income of the Settlement for the year ended 30 June, 2002 is \$xx.xx.

Both husband and wife are full members and each entitled to the distribution.

As President of the National Party of Australia - Victoria, I am holding the total amount distributed by the N.P.A. Vic Settlement in trust for the beneficiaries. Each beneficiary is entitled to his or her share of the net income of the Settlement and this may be claimed by advising me, as President, in writing, on or before 31 August, 2002. In the event that no claim is made by a member, his or her entitlement is then deemed to have been donated to the National Party of Australia - Victoria.

Whether or not your share is actually paid to you, the distribution must be included in your 2002 tax return as assessable income, noting the Settlement tax file no. 73 351 490.


If your entitlement is donated, this distribution plus payments of Party membership fee and other donations to the Party up to \$100.00 per annum can be claimed as a tax deduction. If you are in doubt as to your obligations in this regard please contact your accountant.
