Below is a proposed model response for clearance this afternoon. Email refers. It's a specific question, so I have not provided our full chapter and verse on multiple voting.

Hi Paul

Letters have been sent to individuals where our comparisons of certified (voter) lists show an apparent multiple mark against that voter. Consistent with AEC testimony provided last evening to Senate estimates I can provide a breakdown by state/territory for you, as shown below.

The AEC is currently part-way through a comprehensive process of seeking written responses to the letters and assessing them. This is also process undertaken with the involvement of the relevant AEC divisional returning officer.

For these reasons it is not appropriate to compile the data you seek midstream through a complex process.

The AEC will however, provide submissions to the federal parliamentary Joint Standing Committee on Electoral Matters on the 2016 federal election, including regarding multiple voting, in due course. Submissions to the Committee are published on their website.
