



## NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION AS A POLITICAL PARTY

The Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) has received the following application for registration as a political party under the provisions of the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918* (the Act).

You may lodge an objection if you believe that the party should not be registered under the Act because:

- the party's application has not been correctly made
- the party's name is prohibited.

Objections must be received by the AEC by **24 February 2016**, must be in writing and include your name, street address, signature and the grounds for your objection. Objections can be sent to:
