To whom it may concern,

I wish to submit an objection for the registration of the following party:

name of party: FRAISER ANNING'S CONSERVATIVE NATIONALS PARTY

abbreviation of party: THE CONSERVATIVE NATIONALS

This party fails to meet the requirements in section 129 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act (1918). The specific clause it fails to meet is as follows:

(1) The [Electoral Commission](#) shall refuse an application for the registration of a [political party](#) if, in its opinion, the name of [the party](#) or the [abbreviation](#) of its name that it wishes to be able to use for the purposes of this Act (if any):

...

(da) is one that a reasonable person would think suggests that a connection or relationship exists between [the party](#) and a [registered party](#) if that connection or relationship does not in fact exist; or

The reason the proposed party fails to meet this criteria is that the use of the word "nationals" in the party name and abbreviation of party implies a connection to The Nationals party, and this is a connection or relation that does not exist. As stipulated in section 129, the proposed party name can therefore not be registered.
