**Details:** I would like to comment on: Suggestion 3 by Ben Last. Ben put forward an idea I was contemplating redrawing Mayos northern border with Barker because of the interconnectedness of the Adelaide Hills communities with Barossa council towns in Barker. This transfer of areas from Mayo into Barker from the Adelaide Hills LGA, brings the proposed border in line with the State seats of Heysen and Schubert. Which I think is a fine suggestion and in line with another established border line The other option I contemplated is shown in Suggestion 7 by Luke Dixon where Barker continues down the Murray River to take in some of Alexandria LGA like the state seat of Hammond.
